CTA Transit Bill Stalls Over Whether Chartreuse or Magenta Is Better Name for Train Line

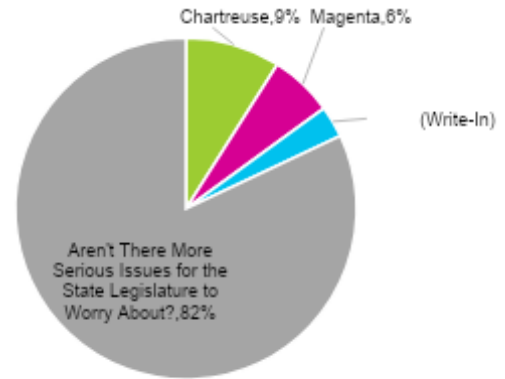

SPRINGFIELD, IL—The Illinois legislature has stalled in passing a transit bill over disagreements on whether chartreuse or magenta would be a better name for a proposed new CTA line.

“We clearly must choose chartreuse for the new line,” said State Senate Majority Leader Kimberly Lightford (D-Westchester). “Chartreuse’s earthy green tones remind CTA riders of our hardworking Illinois farmers.
